 - c. NOT bring any other personal items to Bothell High School or the ceremony such as backpacks, purses, phones, snacks, leis, other adornments, etc.
 - **d.** Be wearing a disposable mask (Falcon mask to be provided for the ceremony).

Introduction

School for seniors does not officially end until the Commencement Exercises conclude on June 16. The final days of seniors' secondary education will be busy, interesting, important, and energizing while they complete final coursework and make final preparations for life after high school. The importance of all of this suggests a need for summarizing vital responsibilities and activities.

Requirements for Participating in Commencement Exercises

Satisfactorily completing all Northshore School District and State of Washington graduation requirements and participating in the commencement rehearsal are prerequisites for participation in the Commencement Ceremony. Additionally, students must clear all fines and obligations. A few days before the final day of classes, seniors' teachers are charged with the responsibility of inspecting and assessing the damage to equipment, supplies, and/or books and adding those items to the fine list, if necessary. Please check at home and return all textbooks, library books, devices, chargers, hotspots, parking hangers, uniforms, locks, cameras, photography and art supplies, equipment and any other property that belongs to the Northshore School District to the staff member who checked it out to the student no later than the week of June 7-11 (Cohort A, June 7-8; Remote Learners, June 9; Cohort B, June 10-11).

Commencement Expectations & Responsibilities

Student, parent, and guardian cooperation in making this year's Commencement Ceremony a successful endeavor is expected and appreciated. The administration, faculty, and classified staff have given the Commencement Ceremony for the Class of 2021 considerable thought and planning. The wish for our seniors' final appearance as a Woodinville High School Falcon is an event that will leave students, parents, grandparents, relatives, and friends proud.

Continuing the WHS tradition of excellence and pride, we are focused on making the ceremony a memorable and dignified event. We are asking that all seniors, parents, guardians and guests join in this focus. The ceremony itself is honorable and one of "pomp and circumstance". It is the expectation of the Northshore School District that all students will follow school rules before, during, and after the Commencement Ceremony. Graduates will be expected to behave appropriately and with respect throughout the ceremony. Please assist us by making sure any items that may

take away from the ceremony (e.g., silly string, firecrackers, beach balls, noisemakers, confetti, etc.) are not brought to the ceremony. Students, parents, and guardians will be monitored for these items, other inflatables, or anything on their person that could cause a disruption to the ceremony.

The moment when a student's name is read is a milestone that will only happen once in a person's lifetime - the culmination of 13 years of schooling. This moment is of significant importance to each graduate's parents or guardians and guests. In an effort to provide a respectful moment for each of our graduates and their families, we are asking that you refrain from excessive celebrating when student names are called so everyone has the opportunity to be proud and to hear their senior's name. The celebration portion of the ceremony will take place following the traditional "turning of the tassel" at the completion of the formal ceremony. Then let's cheer in unity and support of our 2021 graduates with Falcon spirit and pride!

Policy on Substance Use

Any student who is found to have been using alcohol or other drugs at senior end-of-the-year events, extra-curricular activities, or on graduation day will not be allowed to participate in the events and/or the Commencement Ceremony.

Campus Expectations

School continues for underclassmen June 11-18. Seniors are reminded not to return to the WHS campus except for previously scheduled activities or to be working with designated instructors.

Pop Keeney Stadium Entry & Prohibited Items

The main doors of Pop Keeney will open at approximately 5:15 p.m. Masks are required for all in attendance regardless of vaccination status. Please have your tickets ready as no tickets will be available at the door. Guests with a vaccinated ticket are reminded to bring their wristband provided with the ticket at WHS to be able to sit in the vaccinated section of the stadium. Wristbands are not available at Pop Keeney. There will be vaccinated and non-vaccinated sections on both sides of the stadium. Balloons, backpacks, oversized bags, outside food and beverages, confetti (including silly string or similar items), bottles, cans, glass (including vases), coolers, helmets, chains, spikes, tents, laser pointers, fireworks, weapons, animals or pets (except ADA), INFLATABLES and NOISEMAKERS and AIR HORNS are not allowed. There will be no re-entry into the stadium. There is no access to the field. See page 3 for Commencement Ticket information.

Snacks/Concessions

Due to health and safety guidelines, the Pop Keeney concession stand will not be open for the Commencement Ceremony. No open containers are allowed (please to not bring in any food or beverages). Seniors should have a meal prior to arriving at BHS at 3:45 p.m. A light snack will be available for seniors prior to leaving BHS for Pop Keeney Stadium. Page 2

Commencement Ticket Distribution – June 2-11 & 14-16*



Each graduate's family has been allocated a maximum of 4 tickets for the commencement ceremony. Commencement will be live streamed for all those who cannot attend due to the ticket limit. You do not need to accept all 4 tickets. You can pick up 1, 2, 3 or 4 tickets, the exact number is up to your family.

- Families will receive tickets based on the 4 vaccinated/non-vaccinated options outlined below.
- One important change from prior years is that no tickets can be traded or given to anyone other than the intended recipient. Doing so would be a violation of the Governor's orders and could pose a significant health risk.
- There will be a waitlist (at the time of pick up) for vaccinated tickets and non-vaccinated tickets should there be extras, once all have been distributed. The waitlist tickets will be handed out on a lottery system on the 16th.
- There will be NO tickets available at Pop Keeney. All families must pick up their tickets at the WHS ticket booth, located at the main office loop, prior to the event per the schedule outlined on the WHS website at https://woodinville.nsd.org/counseling/class-of-2021/commencement-tickets. Masks are required for ticket pick up.
- A wristband is required for vaccinated ticket holders to enter Pop Keeney. The wristband will be provided with the vaccinated ticket when picked up at WHS.
- ALL fines/fees are required to be paid/cleared prior to receiving the tickets. Fines/Fees must be paid online through TouchBase in advance of picking up the tickets. We are not able to accept payments at the ticket booth. Fine/Fee questions should be directed to whosash@nsd.org.
- Please remember, all seniors get 4 tickets. So there is no rush to come in. We created a schedule we hope will be convenient for everyone.
- Please understand we have a limited capacity in the stadium. Some of our family members will need to watch the ceremony by live stream.

Here is the process to receive your tickets, pick the option that is right for your family:

Option #1: If all ticket holders will be fully vaccinated and past the two-week curative period by the 16th (or are children under 2 years old):

- · Bring all vaccination cards and come to the WHS Ticket Booth to get your Commencement tickets
- A print out of a photo ID and photo/copy of the card is acceptable
- · No tickets can be given to the vaccinated section without proof of vaccination (or without attestation that the child attending is under 2 years old)
- A wristband will be provided for vaccinated ticketholders to bring and wear at Pop Keeney
 - o Remember to bring the wristband to the ceremony, as they will not be available at Pop Keeney!

Option #2: If some ticket holders will be fully vaccinated and past the two-week curative period and others are children ages 2-15 who are not vaccinated and will need to show a negative COVID test within 72-hours of the Commencement Ceremony – to sit in the vaccinated section:

- Be sure to get the negative COVID test no earlier than Sunday, June 13 at 6:00 p.m. (72 hours prior to Commencement day) This is for children ages 2-15 only, not for anyone over the age of 15.
- Bring your children's negative COVID test and all adult vaccination cards and come to the WHS Ticket Booth to get your tickets on June 14-15, 8 a.m. 12 p.m.
- A print out of a photo ID and photo/copy of the card is acceptable
- No tickets can be given to the vaccinated section without proof of vaccination (or without attestation that the child attending is under 2 years old) or for children 2-15, a negative COVID test within 72 hours of Commencement day
- A wristband will be provided for vaccinated ticketholders to bring and wear at Pop Keeney
 - o Remember to bring the wristband to the ceremony, as they will not be available at Pop Keeney!

Option #3: If some ticket holders will be fully vaccinated and past the two-week curative period (or are children under 2 years old) and some will be unvaccinated and you are choosing to sit in two different sections (vaccinated and unvaccinated):

- Bring all adult vaccination cards and come to the WHS Ticket Booth to get your tickets
- No tickets can be given to the vaccinated section without proof of vaccination (or without attestation that the child attending is under 2 years old)
- Tickets to the unvaccinated sections cannot be traded for other tickets and ticket holders are expected to maintain physical distance from other family groups in all unvaccinated sections
- A wristband will be provided for vaccinated ticketholders to bring and wear at Pop Keeney
 - o Remember to bring the wristband to the ceremony, as they will not be available at Pop Keeney!

Option #4: If none of the ticket holders will be fully vaccinated OR if you are choosing to sit in the physically-distanced unvaccinated section:

- Come to the WHS Ticket Booth to get your Commencement tickets
- Tickets to the unvaccinated sections cannot be traded for other tickets and ticket holders are expected to maintain physical distance from other family groups in all unvaccinated sections

Again, tickets cannot be shared, traded or given to anyone other than the intended recipient. Anyone 16 and older, without a vaccine, must sit in the non-vaccinated section (regardless of a negative test, per guidelines).

The main doors of Pop Keeney will open at approximately 5:15 p.m. Masks are required for all in attendance regardless of vaccination status. Please have your tickets ready as no tickets will be available at the door. Guests with a vaccinated ticket will receive a wristband to be able to sit in the vaccinated section of the stadium. There will be vaccinated and non-vaccinated sections on both sides of the stadium.

Onsite parking at BHS, WHS, and Pop Keeney is not available for seniors' or parent/guardian vehicles during the day or overnight June 16-17. Graduating seniors must be dropped off at the Bothell High School, 9130 NE 180th St, Bothell by 3:45 p.m. June 16. (Enter off NE 185th St and drop off in front of NPAC.) This is the last time parents and guardians will have contact with their student until after the ceremony that will conclude no later than 7:30 p.m.

Upon completion of the Commencement Ceremony seniors are released to reunite with their parents/guardians who are responsible for transporting their graduate home from the stadium. Seniors attending the Grad Night Event will depart directly from Pop Keeney. Please note the June 17 morning pick up of seniors who attend the Grad Night Event will be at AMC Loews Woodinville 12 Cinema, 17640 Garden Way NE at 5:00 a.m. Please direct any questions regarding the Grad Night Event to the Senior Parent Group (Kristin Duff at gkduff3@comcast.net or Kim Norris at kimandtom@att.net).

Remember...overnight parking is NOT available at the BHS campus, WHS campus, or at Pop Keeney for any seniors, parents, or guardians June 16-17. NO EXCEPTIONS. A reminder that Senior Class parking hangers must be turned in to Mr. Dillman no later than June 11.

Graduation Regalia

Graduation attire:

- A GREEN cap and gown, along with a class stole and tassel. Valedictorian stoles will be distributed at Bothell High School.
- Gold NHS honor cord and one other WHS pre-approved cord from a nationally recognized club are allowed.
- Flower leis and/or any other adornments are not allowed during the ceremony. Parents/Guardians are welcome to bring other adornments for picture taking when graduates and parents are reunited after the ceremony concludes.
- Tape, signs, flowers, and/or other decorations are NOT permitted on the cap or gown.
- A Falcon mask will be provided. Seniors should wear a disposable mask to Bothell High School.

Recommended clothing for Commencement Day

- Recommended clothing includes dress shirts, ties, dresses, skirts, dress pants, and blouses.
- Dresses worn under the gown should not show at the gown's neckline or below the hemline of the gown. To avoid tripping, long dresses should not be worn.
- Seniors should avoid jeans or tennis shoes.
- No heals will be allowed in the stadium on the turf, flats MUST be worn.

Care of gown:

- If seniors haven't already, place the gown on a hanger and allow it to hang until Commencement day (this permits wrinkles to straighten out and should eliminate the need for pressing). The gown (and cap/tassel/stole) must be brought to BHS June 16 at 3:45 p.m. on a hanger marked with the senior's name. An inexpensive hanger is recommended. Seniors do not have time to retrieve the hanger or other personal items after the ceremony concludes.
- If necessary, press with a cool to lukewarm iron. Be careful! A hot iron will melt the fabric!
- Seniors keep their gowns, caps, stoles, and tassels after the ceremony, they are not returned to Jostens.

Personal Items/Valuables - Secure Storage Not Available

There is no secure storage at Bothell High School or Pop Keeney Stadium. Seniors must NOT bring personal items such as backpacks, purses, make-up bags, phones, cameras, extra clothes, snacks, leis, and/or other non-allowed adornments, etc. to Bothell High School or the ceremony*. Seniors do not have access to retrieve any items from Bothell High School or Pop Keeney Stadium after the recessional. Personal items, valuables, phones, and/or items a senior may want after the ceremony must be kept by parents/guardians and provided to their senior when they reunite upon conclusion of the ceremony. (Please note complimentary feminine products will be available for students in need.) Woodinville High School will not be held responsible for any items that are lost, stolen, or not returned. *Students with medical needs can bring approved medical supplies. Contact Nurse Callahan or Ms. Conrad with questions or concerns.

Alphabetical seat assignments will place seniors on either the "GREEN" side of the stadium that borders the home field stands or the "BLUE" side of the stadium that borders the visitor stands.

- Seniors will be advised of their seat and which side they will be located by the end of the day Friday, June 11 by email in preparation for the <u>REQUIRED</u> rehearsal that takes place <u>Monday</u>, June 14, 9-11 a.m. at the WHS Softball Field.
- ❖ Updated seat assignments, as needed, will also be posted on the WHS Class of 2021 webpage by the end of the day on Monday, June 14.
- As alphabetical seat assignments may need to be adjusted on site if a scheduled senior does not show up to walk at the ceremony, your understanding of possible seating adjustments June 16 is appreciated.
- Seating for guests is first come, first serve by ticket only (see page 2 for additional information regarding ticket details and distribution options). Please do not save seats for others. Guests are not allowed on the field at any time.

Once graduates have departed the field, guests exit their seats and reunite with their graduate on the <u>paved walkways surrounding the</u> <u>perimeter of the field</u> or at a <u>pre-determined destination outside the stadium</u>. Pop Keeney will allow a maximum of 60 minutes for post-Ceremony meet and greets that is subject to the Governor's 6-foot social distancing health and safety guidelines.

Parent Sponsored Grad Night Event

Diploma Packets

- Please note all credits must be officially verified and WHS fines, fees, and/or remaining obligations must be paid or cleared before the diploma, transcript, and other documentation will be released. Students with financial need are encouraged to contact their counselor as soon as possible.
