We are often asked what supplies will help students be prepared for the start of school. As a general rule, students should be supplied with basic items throughout the year. See below for information regarding support for school supplies from the Northshore Schools Foundation.
a. Blue or black pens (. 5 or .7)
b. Pencils (\#2)
c. Highlighters (various colors)
d. College ruled loose-leaf lined paper
e. Binder with a divider for each class
f. Spiral or composition notebooks
g. Flash drive
h. Ruler

WHS Student ID Card - Required, free:
a. All students will be photographed and will be issued an ID card free of charge
b. Students must carry photo ID at school and at extra-curricular activities
c. Students are encouraged to convert the ID card to an ASB card by paying the ASB membership fee that provides benefits such as reduced or free admission to school activities
i. ASB membership is required to participate in athletics or clubs

Student Handbook/Planner - Required, free:
d. Students will be provided with a Student Handbook/Planner for their use during the school year

Individual teachers will provide information for any additional supplies for their class. Look for a syllabus to come home with your student once school begins.

2) Mathematics Classes:
a. All math classes: Graphing paper
b. Algebra 1: A scientific calculator or a TI-84 graphing calculator
c. Geometry: A scientific calculator or a TI-84 graphing calculator, compass and protractor
d. Algebra 2 or above: a $\mathrm{TI}-84$ graphing calculator
3) Science Classes:
a. Composition notebook
d. Highlighter
b. Colored pencils
e. Calculator (no preference)

4) Health \& Fitness - PE Attire:
a. Do's: athletic shoes (with laces); dress code appropriate athletic shorts, sweat pants, warm up pants, and/or yoga pants; t-shirts
b. Don'ts: non-athletic shoes (heels, sandals, boots, flats, etc.), jeans, skirts, dresses, slacks, button down shirts, tank tops, jackets (unless outside and it's cold), revealing clothing
