Juniors & Sophomores Mark Your Calendars: PSAT/NMSQT October 16th

In our continued commitment to our students' college readiness and our ongoing improvement efforts, the <u>annual PSAT/NMSQT exam will be administered to all juniors and sophomores at WHS on Wednesday</u>, October 16^{th} with results

being available in mid-December. The PSAT measures critical reading, math problem solving, and writing skills that are important for success in college and in other post-secondary pursuits and is the qualifying test juniors must take to enter the National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship program. The exam will be administered on-site during the course of the school day. The fee, due Sept 20, has been reduced to \$13.00 for all juniors and sophomores.

Freshmen & the PSAT/NMSQT: Registration/Payment Deadline Monday, September 9

Freshmen have the option to participate in the PSAT/NMSQTduring the on-site October 16 testing window. Freshmen who have paid the reduced \$13.00 exam fee online through TouchBase or in person at WHS by **Monday, September 9** will be registered and have an exam booklet ordered for them. Please note there is no late payment window for freshmen due to College Board ordering deadlines. No exceptions!

If for any reason your 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade student will not be attending school September 5th or will not be returning to WHS for the 2019-2020 school year, please let the Attendance Office know as soon as possible at 425.408.7410 or whsattendance@nsd.org.

The 2019-20 school year will begin for <u>freshmen</u> and <u>NEW to WHS</u> sophomores, juniors, and seniors on Wednesday, September 4 for Link Crew & Orientation Day, followed by <u>ALL students' return on Thursday, September 5</u>. To help our students and families prepare, we invite and welcome all students to attend Falcon Days and are pleased to provide you with preliminary information to help with your summer planning!

Falcon Days were developed as an all-in-one-day opportunity to provide communication, as well as an efficient back to school process needed to help our students and families have the best possible start to the new school year. At Falcon Days, students will have the opportunity to:

- Obtain preliminary class schedules and other key information;
- Have their photo taken and receive their free, required student ID card;
- Purchase ASB memberships, sports participation fees, pre-approved student parking hangers, yearbooks, PSAT exam and class fees and/or fines, and PTSA memberships;
- Learn about activities and clubs;
- Pick up or turn in medical forms or medications; and
- Seniors will receive their current transcript for review.

We look forward to assisting and seeing our new and returning students at Falcon Days! If for some reason a student is unable to attend Falcon Days or is not returning for the 2019-20 school year, please email whsattendance@nsd.org

PAYMENTS

Payments for the 2019-20 school year <u>are accepted during Falcon Days</u> with cash, check payable to WHS, or debit/credit card. <u>After Falcon Days</u>, in-person payments are again accepted <u>beginning Wednesday</u>, <u>September 4</u>, when the Cashier's Office reopens for the 2019-20 school year.

For your planning purposes, as the following payees are different entities, <u>if paying by check</u>, please remember that <u>separate</u> checks are needed for each numbered item below:

- 1. Dorian for photo packages
- 2. WHS PTSA for membership fees
- 3. Vendors who sell spirit wear
- 4. Woodinville High School for fees and/or fines
 - a. All WHS fees/fines can be combined and paid with one check payable to WHS at Falcon Days
 - b. All fines can be paid online 24-hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the school year
 - c. **Beginning Tuesday, August 20**, various WHS fees such as: sports participation, ASB membership, pre-approved parking, yearbooks, and the PSAT exam can also be paid <u>online</u> through TouchBase from the WHS website homepage under the "Resources", "Payments" link by logging in with the parent/guardian's TouchBase user name and password
 - i. If payment is made online, the student must bring a copy of the receipt to Falcon Days
 - ii. Parents can also view outstanding fines/fees on TouchBase, view payment history, and print receipts

Please note:

- Fines/fees must be paid or cleared to purchase parking hangers and to participate in athletics and/or clubs
 - o Students are welcome to bring books and/or equipment that are on the fine list to Falcon Days
- The October 16th on-site PSAT/NMSQT exam is administered to all 10th and 11th graders and is optional for 9th graders
- All students turning out for sports and/or clubs are required to purchase ASB membership

ASB MEMBERSHIP

• The student's required free ID card is validated with the ASB logo once ASB membership (\$60) is purchased. Don't miss out on the many benefits of ASB membership, including reduced or free admission to school activities. An ID card with the ASB logo is required to participate in sports and any ASB sponsored activity or club. Students who pay for ASB membership and are photographed at Falcon days will have the ASB logo embedded in their free ID card. Students who pay for ASB membership after school starts will have an ASB sticker with the logo added to their ID card.

STUDENT CLASS SCHEDULES

Students will receive their preliminary schedule during Falcon Days. If a freshman is unable to attend Falcon Days, his or her preliminary schedule will be available at Link Crew & Orientation Day on September 4. Sophomores, juniors, and seniors <u>new</u> to WHS will receive their preliminary schedule at New Student Link Crew Orientation September 4. <u>Returning</u> sophomores, juniors, and seniors will receive their schedule the first day of school, September 5.

Additionally, staffing is often adjusted just before classes begin, which necessitates revising some students' schedules. All students will receive their official 2019-20 schedules on September 5 in their 1st period class. It is very important ALL students go to the Commons prior to 7:30 a.m. September 5 to identify their correct 1st period class. If a student does not have a 1st period class, their schedule will be available in the Counseling Office.

LOCKER ASSIGNMENTS

Students who <u>fully intend to use a locker</u> may sign up for one on a first-come, first-served basis at Falcon Days or during the first few weeks of school. Due to the limited number of lockers, students must share a locker with at least one, but no more than two, other students and <u>will be allowed to sign up for a locker at Falcon Days if they have a designated locker partner(s) present or with proof of a designated locker partner(s). Once school begins, locker assignments are coordinated through the Attendance Office.</u>

YEARBOOKS

- Yearbooks are sold on a <u>pre-sale basis ONLY</u> for \$55 each <u>online August 20</u> or <u>online and in person</u> during <u>Falcon Days August 21-22</u>, as well as <u>September 4-20</u>, and <u>December 2-20</u>. PURSUANT TO RESALE TAX RULES, YEARBOOKS WILL NOT BE SOLD AT ANY OTHER TIME DURING THE 2019-20 SCHOOL YEAR.
- Please plan accordingly as many students who believe they do not want a yearbook during the sale windows at the start of the year feel differently as the school year comes to a close and they are unable to purchase one!
- As yearbooks are pre-sold, please be reminded that if during the course of the year more than one yearbook is purchased, there will be **NO**REFUNDS. If you purchase two yearbooks, you will be given two books, not one book and a refund for the other.
- For senior yearbook photo information and requirements, visit the WHS website, Activities, Yearbook link or see page 8 of this flyer.

MEDICAL FORMS/MEDICATIONS

Students can stop by the nurse's office during Falcon Days to pick up or turn in medical forms or medications. Our school nurse, Christie Callahan, will be available to answer related questions and assist you.



STUDENT PICTURES: ID CARDS & PICTURE PACKAGE PRE-ORDERING

- Every student will have a WHS ID card picture taken. The WHS photo ID card is <u>free</u> of charge.
- Students must carry photo ID at school and at activities at all times. Students are expected to give their name/show photo ID to any staff member who asks for it during the school day or at a school-sponsored event.
- For students who are purchasing picture packages, <u>a separate check is needed for</u> <u>each student payable to "Dorian", the</u> <u>photography company.</u>
- Pre-orders for picture packages may now be placed online at https://ios.mydorian.com using WHS access key X77XN5B9. Online preorders using WHS's access key are available up to 4 days after picture day. If you do not order online, a barcoded Dorian picture order form will arrive in your mailbox prior to Falcon Days that must be completed and brought with your student.
- If a student is unable to attend Falcon Days, picture make ups will take place Tuesday, September 10. Retakes for all students are Thursday, October 10.

Class of 2020 Senior Yearbook Photos: Due Thursday, October 31, 2019

Provided size and other requirements are met, as outlined below, seniors can submit a photograph for the yearbook from whichever professional photographer a family chooses; OR a photograph taken by an amateur; OR seniors can choose to have the free Dorian photo (taken for their required ID card during Falcon Days or on make-up day September 10) published in the yearbook.

All images taken by Dorian are sent directly to our yearbook adviser, Ms. Alder. Seniors who may want a different senior photo published in the yearbook other than the one Dorian provides must submit the photo via an upload directly to Balfour* per the following guidelines:

- Senior photos must be uploaded by Thursday, October 31, 2019
- The image should be in JPEG format
- Since our yearbook is a reference for the school year, the image must be a vertical headshot of head and shoulders (No hats, no animals, no face paint, and no props just the student. Photo submitted that are not head/shoulder shots will be zoomed in by the yearbook editors.)
- The image must be 300 dpi (Maximum file size is 10MB per image. Be sure cell phone photos or photos from the web meet these size requirements so they can be reproduced in the yearbook. If the senior is working with a professional photographer, please upload the original file from your photographer.)
- There is no need to resize your photo. All photos uploaded per the size requirements specified above will be adjusted to fit the yearbook specifications.

*Details regarding the upload of senior yearbook photos will follow after school starts, well before the October 31 deadline. Once the information becomes available, most professional photographers can upload the image for the senior or can provide the senior with a .jpeg image digitally for the senior to upload themselves.

PARENTVUE: Access to View Grades/Attendance/Student Details TOUCHBASE: Access to Make Online Payments/View Account Balance & Payment History

Access ParentVUE to View Grades/Attendance/Student Details

ParentVUE is a web-based application that provide parents and guardians with information regarding their student via a secure website.

- **ParentVUE** allows parents and guardians to view grades including grades for specific assignments. Please consult with your students' teacher(s) for more information on the specific reports they post.
- Students access their information via StudentVUE, a separate web-based application, and are provided with their own username and
 password. Parents/Guardians must not share their login information to their ParentVue account with their student, as ParentVUE accounts
 afford parents/guardians with the ability to change their demographic and contact information.

The link to *ParentVUE* can be found on the WHS homepage at <u>woodinville.nsd.org</u> under "Resources". Parents and guardians are provided with an **Activation Key** to then establish their username and password. If a parent/guardian has more than one student, this login information will provide access to all of their students throughout NSD. <u>Usernames and passwords for Leota Middle School and Timbercrest Middle School students remain the same and carry forward to Woodinville High School.</u>

Where do parents/guardians new to WHS obtain their ParentVUE Activation Key?

If you are a parent/guardian who is new to WHS and need an Activation Key to establish a username and password to access *ParentVUE* there are two options:

- 1. Appear in person at the WHS Attendance Office, show ID, and pick up the Activation Key or
- 2. **Send an <u>email request</u> with your student's name to whsattendance@nsd.org** requesting the information. The email address will be confirmed and the information will then be emailed to the parent/guardian.

We apologize for the inconvenience; however, Activation Keys cannot be provided verbally over the phone due to the sensitivity of the information involved.

Forgot your ParentVUE username and password?

Once a parent/guardian establishes a username and password, WHS does not have access to it. If lost, parents/guardians should follow the prompts on the *ParentVUE* site to recover it.

TOUCHBASE: Access to Make Online Payments, View Account Balance & Payment History

TouchBase is a web-based application that allows parents/guardians with the ability to <u>make payments</u> <u>online</u> and view their student's account balance and payment history. Although cash, checks, and debt/credit cards are accepted at the Cashier's Office and Main Office at WHS, making payments online through TouchBase is a constant 24/7 method of payment available for our families.

The link to make online payments at TouchBase can be found on the WHS homepage at woodinville.nsd.org under "Resources>Payments". Like ParentVUE, where parents/guardians check student grades, usernames and passwords for Leota Middle School and Timbercrest Middle School students remain the same and carry forward to WHS and if a parent/guardian has more than one student, the TouchBase login information will provide access to all of their students' accounts.

Parents/Guardians in need of their <u>assigned</u> TouchBase username and password should come to the WHS Attendance Office or email whsattendance at nsd.org. We are unable to provide the information over the phone.

Download the District Mobile App

WHS families are encouraged to download the <u>District's mobile app.</u> It's free from the App Store or Google Play (works only on Android or iOS devices). Just search for "Northshore School District."

Here are just a few of the things you can do with it:

- Follow our school calendar and easily add events directly to your device calendar
- Look up our staff contact information under Woodinville High School in the Schools Directory.
- Check our school menu.
- Pay for meals through a link to PayPams.
- Follow our school to receive news and notifications.

If you log in, you can also check information about your student(s), such as grades, classes, attendance, cafeteria balance, checked-out library books, bus stop times -- and set alerts for some of these.

Families are encouraged to set up or update their ParentVUE accounts now -- if they haven't already -- to be able to access student information in the mobile app. (Visit the district BSD Website, Resources, Mobile App)

To make online payments and/or check your student's payment history, parents will continue to log into <u>TouchBase</u> with their TouchBase user name and password.

Student Lunch Accounts

There are two methods available for parents to make prepayments into their student's lunch accounts:

- By delivering cash or a check payable to NSD or WHS to the WHS Kitchen in the commons;
- **2.** Online through <u>PayPAMS</u> (Parent Account Management Systems).

Please note:

- Cash or checks received at the WHS Kitchen right up until lunch begins and throughout both lunches will be applied at that time
- Fees are not charged when a family pays by cash or check at WHS
- The student's ID number should be included with all payments
- The PayPAMS program accepts VISA (credit/debit), Master Card, or Discover and charges a \$1.95 processing fee per transaction.
- The school district does not accept credit card payments via the food service phone number or at WHS

TRACK MEAL BALANCES

You can view your student's meal account balance, at no charge, with PayPAMS at www.PayPAMS.com or with the Northshore School District Mobile App. The mobile app is free and available in the App Store or Google Play (iOS or Android only) by searching for "Northshore School District". The district's Mobile App webpage at www.nsd.org/mobileapp provides more information about this feature and offers step-by-step login instructions.



Medications & Immunizations

- ✓ Anyone planning to keep medication with the nurse during the school year should be planning to have the "Authorization for Medication" form filled out and sent in before the first day of school. That form can be accessed from the Health Room page found on the WHS website or from the Health Services page on the Northshore School District website.
- ✓ If your student carries an Epi Pen, or has ever been prescribed epinephrine for an allergic reaction, he or she must have an Authorization for Medication on file in the WHS Health Room and is required to have an Epi Pen on campus at all times (the nurse will check at the beginning of the school year) in order to be at school OR a signed letter from his or her physician stating that epinephrine is not required. All medication orders, including Epi pen orders, must be renewed each school year. The "Authorization for Medication" form can be download from the WHS or Northshore School District website and must be delivered to the Health Room prior to the first day of school.
- ✓ Please check the ParentVue site to verify that your child's immunization profile is in compliance. Your child is legally required to have all immunizations entered and in compliance in order to be at school. Please update any missing shot records prior to the first day of school. Your doctor's office or the Department of Health may be able to assist you if you have any questions about requirements.

STUDENT DELIVERIES & PHONE MESSAGES

As we head into September, please note that items brought to students necessary for their coursework during the school day must be delivered to the Main Office where they will be held for students to pick up during non-class hours. To preserve valuable classroom time the Main Office cannot send passes for students or deliver items to them, and items such as gifts, balloons, and flowers must remain in the Main Office until the end of the school day.

Please take care of communications regarding appointments, etc. at home and make any arrangements for early dismissals in advance or in the morning through the Attendance Office, as personal phone messages for students cannot be delivered to classrooms unless they are an emergency.

ATTENDANCE HIGHLIGHTS

Our student day is from 7:30 a.m. to 2:35 p.m. and WHS expects all students to attend school every day. Below are a few highlights of our attendance policy and procedures:

- Absences <u>must be</u> excused within two (2) school days of the absence or the absence will stay unexcused and result in progressive discipline.
 Absences will not be excused after the two (2) school day time frame.
- If a student misses more than 15 minutes of class, it is considered an absence.
- If a student has three (3) or more days of unexcused absences in a class, regardless of total number of absences, a conference with administration is needed.
- If a student requires an early dismissal, the student should come to the Attendance Office <u>before school or during Options</u> with a parent/guardian signed request. Phone call and email request for early dismissal are no longer allowed.
- Students who arrive late to school (both excused and unexcused) must check in at the Attendance Office for a pass before proceeding to class.

STUDENT ON-CAMPUS PARKING 2019-2020

Beginning Wednesday, September 11th, **students must have a valid WHS 2019-2020 parking hanger in their car to park on the WHS campus**. Students are strongly encouraged to ride the school bus or carpool for space and environmental reasons. Parking hanger applications for the 2019-2020 school year were accepted at the end of last school year. Payment for students pre-approved to purchase a WHS parking pass can be made online starting Wednesday, August 20th. Payment in-person can be made on **Falcon Days,** August 21st and 22nd and then once school begins. All fines must be paid before a parking hanger can be issued. Students who pay online should bring in their receipt of payment when picking up their parking hanger. Students trying out for fall CUT sports or activities will be approved for a parking hanger after school starts and once the sports and activity rosters are available from the coaches/advisors.

On Falcon Days, parking applications will be available again. Please submit applications with a photocopy of current auto insurance and driver's license to Jeani Schwenk, Campus Supervisor at the beginning of the new year. Late applications will be processed once school starts. *Students who do not have a parking hanger on September11th must park on the street until it is purchased.* The cost of parking hangers is \$130 per year/\$55 per seasonal sport/activity. <u>The purchase of a parking hanger does not guarantee students a parking space every day.</u> All parking is on a first-come, first-served basis in designated student parking areas. Parking on the WHS campus is limited. Please see the priority parking plan below.

The parking priority plan is as follows:

- Seniors with WANIC/Health Science/Running Start class where there is no district shuttle offered.
- Juniors with WANIC/Health Science/Running Start class where there is no district shuttle offered.
- Seniors who participate in after school sanctioned sports and pre-approved after school activities.

- · Seniors who have waivers or work after school.
- Remaining seniors in the lottery.

Dress Code

WHS continually attempts to provide the best educational environment for our students, faculty and staff. Students are required to come to school dressed appropriately for the school workplace. Students are expected to dress in a manner that is not disruptive to the educational process.

- As families prepare clothing for school, please be sure to purchase clothing without tobacco, illegal acts, drugs, alcohol, obscene language, weapons, violence or sexually suggestive logos or references. Bandanas that are displayed or worn are not allowed and any combination of clothing reasonably determined to be gang-related, or clothing which law enforcement agencies currently consider gang-related is prohibited.
- The following are not appropriate at school: low-cut tops, tube tops, bandanas as tops, tank and/or halter tops that do not cover the middle of the back, tops that expose the midriff, skirts, shorts and ripped jeans that do not reach the length of the student's index finger when the arm is extended and pants or tops that do not cover undergarments. Please also remember that for health and safety, shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.

The dress code at our school is an important part of creating a positive and non-disruptive learning environment for all students. Our students' dress reflects the quality of the school, their conduct, and their schoolwork.

If a student is wearing attire that is found to be offensive, disruptive or in violation of our school policy, the student will be asked to change clothes and will be subject to progressive discipline as outlined in the WHS Student Handbook.

ONLINE REGISTRATION with FinalForms

Athletics registration is done online through FinalForms. Your information is saved from season-to-season and year-to-year, making the registration process quick and easy. You may also register for multiple seasons at the same time. Registration for fall sports is due Monday, August 19. Registrations will still be accepted, but will be reviewed in the order completed. Please click Register for Athletics in the drop-down menu under the WHS Athletics website and follow the FinalForms instructions to register.

Failure to register online and have your registration approved prior to the first day of tryouts/practice makes an individual ineligible for a tryout/practice session. All coaches have been directed not to permit ANY student the opportunity to turnout and put the coach and school in an unnecessary liability situation.

FALL SPORTS REGISTRATION DUE DATE: Monday, August 19. Until registration is approved, practice time will not be counted.

PHYSICALS: Sports physicals are valid for two years. You may submit a physical by scanning and emailing your copy to Renae Hector at rhector@nsd.org, delivering the hard copy to the WHS Athletic Office or faxing it to 425-408-7402. If you prefer to send personal documents securely, use this link mailfile.nsd.org/filedrop/rhector@nsd.org. Sports physical forms can be downloaded from the WHS Athletics website under Register for Athletics.

ACADEMICS: The Northshore School District has a minimum 2.0 GPA requirement in addition to the WIAA (Washington Interscholastic Activities Association) standard for academics the previous semester.

WIAA Standard - NEW - Beginning in 19/20 Northshore School District is moving to a 7-period class schedule

- For the initial grade check for fall and winter sports only, all athletes must have passed 5 of 6 (or 6 of 7 etc.) classes the previous semester.
- For all other grade checks, all athletes must be enrolled in and passing a minimum 6 of 7 classes for the current semester.

For the initial grade check in the fall, an incoming ninth grade student is not required to meet the WIAA previous semester scholarship rule provided he/she has met all other eligibility requirements. Thereafter the student's grades will be monitored by the school every three (3) to six (6) weeks; and students will be required to meet all eligibility standards.

RUNNING START, HOME SCHOOL or other ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION: Students must complete either the "Running Start Students and WIAA Eligibility", "Alternative Education and WIAA Eligibility" or "Home Based Education & WIAA Eligibility" form. In addition, please include proof of enrollment, class schedule and grades. Forms are available during the FinalForms registration process and under "Students Who Don't Attend Full-Time" on the WHS Athletic website under Register for Athletics.

FINES: Students must have no outstanding school fines.

ASB MEMBERSHIP: Must be purchased prior to the first competitive contest (\$60.00).

PARTICIPATION FEE: Must be paid prior to the first game of each sports season, after cuts are made. Payment can be made online or in-person at the Cashier's or Main Office.

- \$154 fee for each high school sport.
- Individuals participating in more than one season will pay a maximum of \$308 per school year.
- Families with two or more students participating at the same high school during the same season will be charged \$121 per participant up to a family limit of \$484 per year.
- Families with two or more students participating at both high school and middle school level will have a family limit of \$396 per year.

DAILY ATTENDANCE (Practice or Contest): To participate in athletics students must attend a minimum of ½ the classes offered on that day.

The form must be submitted annually and is due to our Counseling Center between the first day of school and October 1st.

Dear Parents.

Northshore schools continue to be among the safest schools in the state. However, all of us in the community must work together to ensure that our schools remain safe. It is unfortunate that firearms and dangerous weapons threaten the safety of children and youth. To address this issue consistent with recent state and federal legislation, Northshore has adopted school board policy concerning the Regulation of Dangerous Weapons and procedures concerning weapons in the Statement of Rights and Responsibilities Concerning Student Conduct.

Under the law (RCW 9.41.280) *, it is a gross misdemeanor for any person (student, staff, parent or patron) to carry a firearm or dangerous weapon onto school property, including school buses, school and non-school facilities being used for school activities. It is illegal for any student or non-student under 18 years of age to have a weapon on campus, regardless of whether the weapon is in a locked vehicle and the owner has the proper permits. The law also requires that schools have signs prohibiting the presence of guns. Northshore's schools have signs stating that schools are gun and drug free zones.

It is very important that students and parents understand the consequences of violating this law and district policy. A weapons violation may constitute grounds for immediate expulsion from the district subject to due process and the right to appeal. If a student brings a firearm to school, legislation provides that the student be expelled from the state's public schools for one year. If a dangerous weapon other than a firearm is involved, a student may also be suspended. Objects used as a weapon or that look like weapons, such as toy guns or knives, may be treated in the same manner as real weapons. School officials must notify law enforcement of a weapons violation. Other school districts may refuse to admit students expelled for such an offense. The law and district policy is presented in the Rights and Responsibilities Handbook Concerning Student Conduct in the Behavioral Violations section on Weapons.

Please find an opportunity to discuss this issue with your son or daughter. Ultimately, it is the student who makes the decision whether to bring a weapon to school. Students need to understand that weapons will not be tolerated. Principals and Assistant Principals also rely heavily on students to recognize that the presence of a weapon at school is wrong. Students need to communicate to school officials about the presence of a weapon at school. Students need as much support as possible from parents, peers, and school staff to take this step.

With students, parents, school staff and our community facing this issue together, Northshore schools will remain a safe and positive learning environment.

Injuries at School & Optional Student Insurance

Parent/Guardian Financial Responsibility for Injuries Occurring at School:

The health and safety of our students is one of the district's foremost concerns. Even so, accidents may and do happen and the resulting medical bills (ambulance transport, surgery, etc.) can be very expensive. However, many families are unaware that the district does not carry insurance for student personal injury costs and cannot assume responsibility for them.

What this basically means is that if your child gets hurt during school or a school activity, you as the parent or guardian, are financially responsible for any medical bills. This includes students participating in athletics, recess and after school activities. If your student participates in a sport, please make certain your family insurance plan covers athletic participation.

As a service, we are providing this information regarding optional student accident and health insurance coverage administered by Myers-Stevens & Toohey, Inc. Coverage is available for:

- Interscholastic Tackle Football
- School-Time Accident Plan
- Full-Time 24/7 Accident Plan
- Accident & Sickness Plan
- Dental Accident Plan

These low cost plans are used by many school districts across Washington. Although they are not the only provider of this type of coverage, they have been recommended by our Washington Schools Risk Management Pool.

Changes to MMR Vaccine Personal and Philosophical Exemptions

July 24, 2019

Dear parents and guardians,

As of July 28, 2019, a new state law removes the personal and philosophical option to exempt children from the MMR vaccine required for school and child care attendance. *Medical and religious exemptions are not affected by this new law*.

Based on this new law, families will need to provide updated healthcare provider verified immunization paperwork at or before the start of the 2019-20 school year if their student has a personal/philosophical exemption for the MMR vaccine. Children without a medical or religious exemption will need two doses of MMR vaccine to be allowed into school, starting on Wednesday, September 4, 2019.

Because MMR vaccine doses must be administered at least a month apart, children may be entered into school if they have healthcare provider verified paperwork showing at least one dose of MMR vaccine by the beginning of the school year. This will allow a conditional status for up to 30 days, at which point families will need to provide records showing their child received the second dose of vaccine.

In Summary:

- Personal/philosophical exemptions for MMR are no longer valid
- Children need healthcare provider verified proof of MMR vaccination by the first day of school
- Children not compliant with state vaccine requirements may be excluded from school

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Google Apps for Education & Optional Opt Out

Northshore School District has the ability to create Google Apps for Education accounts for all students to gain access to the wealth of collaborative tools available through Google Apps (Google Docs, Gmail, Calendar, plus additional services).

These accounts will be used for school-related work only including communication for school-related projects, collaboration with peers, storage and access to documents, and interaction with teachers. Northshore's custom implementation of Google Apps for Education creates a secure and supervised learning environment for all students. Google Apps accounts provide students easy access to work on their documents from any location with an internet connection. Access can be through a computer or almost any mobile device or tablet. The Google Apps environment is a collaborative space for working with other students and teachers on project-based learning allowing for real-time editing and sharing. Google Apps accounts also give students access to personalized tools to help support their organization and communication (email and calendar, etc). Students without an NSD Google Apps account will have an impact to their full educational experience and may need to complete alternate assignments and may not be able to fully participate in all classroom experiences.
